Children Mental Health week – 3rd – 7th February 2025

The theme for 2025 is focus is **Know Yourself, Grow Yourself**, with the aim to equip and empower children and young people across the UK to embrace self-awareness and explore what it means to them. We want children and young people to discover how getting to know who they are can help them build resilience, grow and develop.

Throughout the week that children will be completing discussions or activities to support the development of self-awareness and resilience.

E-Safety – Tuesday 11th February 2025

The theme is '**Too good to be true? Protecting yourself from scams online**' but during our computing lesson will go through being safe online with the children. Every year at the beginning of computing, the first topic is about keeping safe online but it's important to continually talk to the children about how to keep themselves safe with today's technology forever evolving.

As adults, Artificial Intelligence (AI) systems use data to learn and improve, identifying patterns and relationships that we might not notice. So it is just as important that us as adults are vigilant. Scams are on the increase and they will try anything to deceive or fraud to trick people into giving away their personal or financial information via text messages, emails or phone calls. So we all need to be vigilant.

Reading

As a school we are wanting to give reading a push. Therefore, children who read:
